




DOCTOR FAUSTUS

CHRISTOPHER MARLOWE

THURSDAY FRIDAY AND SATURDAY NOVEMBER 12 13 AND 14 2015

Christopher Marlowe (baptized 26 February 1564 - 30 May 1593), was the foremost Elizabethan tragedian of his day, as well as a poet and translator of the Elizabethan era. A child of the English Renais-



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sance and the Reformation, he shared his birth year with Galileo and Shake-speare. He was a part of a group of intellectuals, mathematicians, astronomers, geographers, philosophers and poets who formed a club nicknamed "The School of Night" which met secretly to discuss the forbidden knowledge of new scientific thought. They were called Free-Thinkers and were all stigmatized as "Atheists" by Church authorities in order to discredit them in the eyes of the ignorant.

Good, Evil and the Morality Play in Doctor Faustus

Elizabethan drama gradually evolved out of the religiously-themed plays frequently performed during the medieval period. These religious plays, the most popular of which were called 'morality plays,' were usually sponsored by the Church and depicted battle the between good and evil forces for men's souls (the most famous of these plays is the anonymously-penned play *Everyman*, in which a good angel and evil angel try to convince the lead character, Everyman, to join their respective sides.) Christopher Marlowe clearly draws on conventions from traditional morality plays in Doctor Faustus. Yet Marlowe, an accused atheist (Queen Elizabeth ordered his arrest for being an atheist in 1593,) makes this struggle between good and evil more complicated.

Director's Note

In the Gospels, Jesus tells us that what defiles comes from within. Theater is an art form that makes the internal external, so the evil that we see in this play is really all inside of Faustus. The Good Angel and Bad Angel are not heavenly beings but the voice of Faustus' conscience. His damnation is a result of his own choice to reject the good in the end. We see Faustus' inner battle and we also see Mephistophilis' regret. This play is a warning to all of us that someday we too will have to make a choice.
